


Associate Professor Eric Hau is a radiation oncologist at Westmead and Blacktown Hospitals. His clinical practice is treating patients with lung and brain tumours as well as stereotactic ablative radiation therapy. He leads the Translational Radiation Biology & Oncology research program at the Westmead Institute for Medical Research with a particular focus on the role of hypoxia in treatment resistance and radiation/drug combinations.



Professor Paul Keall is a Professor of Medical Physics and the Director of the Image X Institute, University of Sydney. He leads a stellar team engaged in inventing, developing and implementing a portfolio of highly innovative imaging and radiation therapy targeting methods and technologies.







Murray McLachlan is the deputy chair and secretary of Cancer Voices NSW, board member for Health Consumers NSW and executive committee member at Cancer Voices Australia. Murray's other areas of advocacy include as the independent consumer representative director of the Trans-Tasman Radiation Oncology Group Cancer Research Board, and the consumer representative on the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Radiologists Interventional Radiology Committee. His personal experience with cancer has included the death of his long-term partner from pancreatic cancer in 2007, and his own successful surgical intervention for prostate cancer in 2009.







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
